What is Planned Giving? What could I give and how? Planned giving is the process of designing charitable gifts so that the donor realizes charitable objectives while maximizing tax deductions and other financial benefits. Planned gifts are often gifts from a donor's assets, donor's death, or they may be current gifts for current charitable purposes. Types of gifts, other than cash, that the Alberta Conference has received include appreciated securities (the donor does not have to pay capital gains tax if the securities are transferred directly to the Conference), bequests through Wills or life insurance policies, revocable and irrevocable trusts, charitable remainder trusts and charitable gift annuities. Did you know that RSPs & RIFs can also pass tax-free to registered Canadian charities?

The Seventh-day Adventist Church in Canada Revolving Fund is also accepting deposits to assist with church building projects. Interest can either be paid to you or it can accumulate in your revolving fund account. Any balance remaining in these deposits may be left to beneficiaries through a trust document. The MAIN reason donors make planned gifts is in support of Jesus' various entreaties to spread the Gospel, feed the hungry, clothe the naked, assist the stranger, "...*freely ye have received, freely give*" (Matt. 10:8).
