Somewhere between joining the globe's wealthy in the revered '1% Club,' and becoming spiritually bankrupt, Jesus knocked on the door of Julian Archer's heart—again. Scrambling over the mountain of blessings that he'd piled up inside his heart, he pulled hard on the door handle, but it wouldn't budge. What now?

After a fast-paced business career, Julian retired in his thirties and founded Faith vs Finance—a global ministry working with Christians who seek to maintain a vibrant relationship with Jesus amidst the distractions and pressures of careers, business and materialism.

He writes, "For way too long I got my energy from making profit graphs soar upwards. This had some lovely perks, but it also seriously taxed my relationship with Jesus—not that I really admitted it at the time as I was still an 'active church member'." Woven into his time tapestry, Julian has also escorted mafia drug dealers around



Italy, negotiated with terrorists in the Himalayas, patted tarantulas in Argentina, and eaten the salivary gland of a calf.

Julian is the author of HELP! I've Been Blessed! How to stop God's blessings from becoming curses and he loves to share the testimony Christ has given him. He is married to a Proverbs 31 wife, Melinda, and has two great sons. They live beside a wildlife-rich, mountain stream in southern Queensland, Australia.

She also co-authored *The Celt and The Christ: A Fresh Look at the Book of Galatians*.

Dr. Williams' influence is profoundly felt around the world by countless participants in her ground-breaking counseling and internationally applauded television series, *A Painted World: Portraits of Illusion and Reality*. Her conversion story and spiritual journey is televised regularly on Trinity Broadcasting Network and Hope Channel Television. Dr. Williams appreciates every opportunity to share the Gospel and approaches her role as teacher, preacher and counselor as a sacred trust.

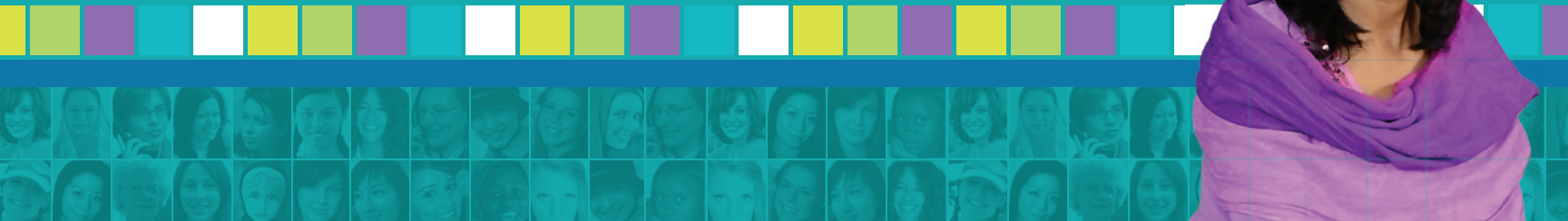

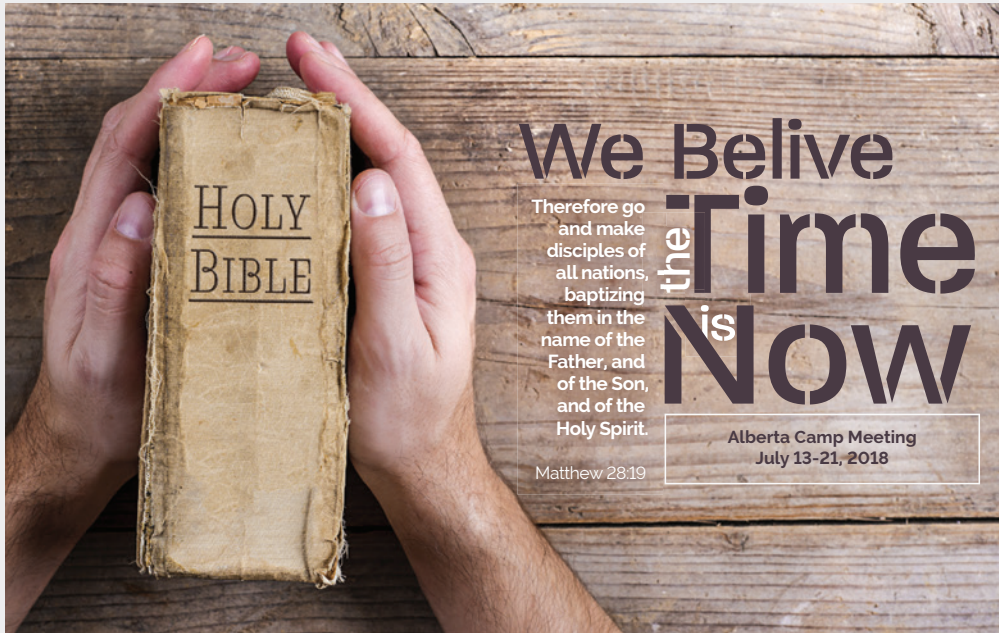

1. Quiet time is 11:00 p.m.
2. Children under 18 years of age are not permitted to stay overnight at the campground unless under adult supervision of an immediate family member.
3. Individuals are discouraged from bringing pets onto the campground during camp meeting. If you bring your pet you will be asked to move to a designated non serviced site. If you are unwilling to comply with the pet policy your accommodation will be assigned to another guest next year. Thank you in advance for your cooperation. Please see the list of nearby kennels:

4. Bicycles, skateboards, water guns, firearms, etc. are not permitted on the campground.
5. Campers in the 15 amp sites are prohibited from using air conditioners or other major electrical appliances due to inadequate electrical power.
6. The maximum occupancy on any camping site is one camping unit plus one same-family tent.
7. A maximum of two vehicles are permitted at one RV site, campsite, or cabin.
8. Camping is ONLY permitted in assigned areas.
9. No open fires are permitted on the campground, either indoors or outdoors. This includes candles, citronella pails, torches, or open flame of any kind.
10. A \$10 per key CASH deposit will be required at registration for all cabins, lodge rooms, and division buildings.

The deposit will be refunded when you return the key[s] upon departure.

11. The cafeteria will provide all meals, including Sabbaths, with the exception of the Sunday lunch which is the International Food Fair. Meal tickets are only available at the Camp Administration Office. No meal tickets will be sold during Sabbath hours. Unused meal tickets will NOT be refunded.
12. 2018 REGISTRATION: If you wish to register for the same camping site you have this year and you still meet size specifications for that site, you must fill out a registration form at the camp office BEFORE TUESDAY, July 18, 2017.
 - Beginning WEDNESDAY, July 19 at 9:00 a.m. you may turn in a request for a site change for 2018. No promise will be made to you, but we will try to honour your request if possible. You will be notified at a later date.

13. Please do not wash your vehicle or RV while on the campgrounds. Water supplies are limited.
14. Parents, please ensure that your children have adequate skin protection for all outdoor activities. Wearing a T-shirt is recommended for water-ski outings to guard against a serious sunburn.
15. Solicitation, merchandise sales, and distribution of literature by unauthorized persons is not permitted on the campgrounds. If you wish to promote personal and private CDs, etc., you must obtain pre-approval from the manager of the Adventist Book Centre.
16. Lifestyle in the Seventh-day Adventist Church promotes the non-use of tobacco, alcohol or illicit drugs. Use of these in any form is not permitted.
17. Parking in driveways is not permitted. Avoid double-parking and blocking others. Infractions may necessitate your car being towed away.
18. Small appliances such as kettles, rice cookers and microwaves are not permitted to be used in the lodge rooms.
19. Scent Free - Please be mindful of those who struggle with allergy issues. Avoid wearing strong scented perfumes and lotions.
20. Prevent fires and notify security personnel immediately of any fire or perceived fire risks.



Please note: In the event of any of the following emergency situations, the camp Fire Marshal and security will be on hand to assist you in following these procedures.

Tornado

In case of tornado warning, evacuate the campground in an orderly fashion. Make sure you have all your family members accounted for. DO NOT hook up your trailer or pack. Get in your vehicle and leave in the designated direction away from the oncoming tornado.

If a tornado is imminent [no time to evacuate] do the following:

1. Be alert to stay away from the vicinity of power lines.
2. Stay out of cars.
3. Lie flat on the ground in a low area.
4. The disabled and the elderly need to go in the basement of the Lodge.

Fire

In case of fire in a building, walk quietly but quickly to the nearest exit and proceed to a safe distance from the building.

1. DO NOT panic. DO NOT rush, push, or overtake.
2. Follow instructions of the Fire Marshal and security.
3. Keep noise to a minimum so that all instructions may be easily heard.
4. DO NOT return to the building until all clear is given by the Fire Marshal.
5. Call 911.

Severe lighting storm

- Stay away from water, metal objects, all electrical devices, telephones, vehicles and other substances that will conduct electricity.
- All campers are to take shelter in a safe place.

- Avoid standing under high objects.
- Alert staff to possible fire or other emergencies.
- Unplug all electronics.

Severe storms

1. Proceed to shelters [main building, lodge, bathrooms].
2. Cabin residents, stay in your cabin.
3. If sufficient notice, retract all awnings, tie downs and put any loose objects inside your RVs.

LOOK for weather updates on main bulletin board or listen to the camp radio station at 106.3 FM.

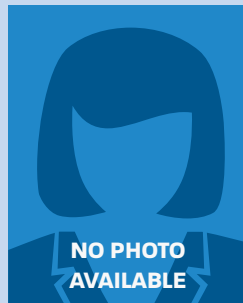

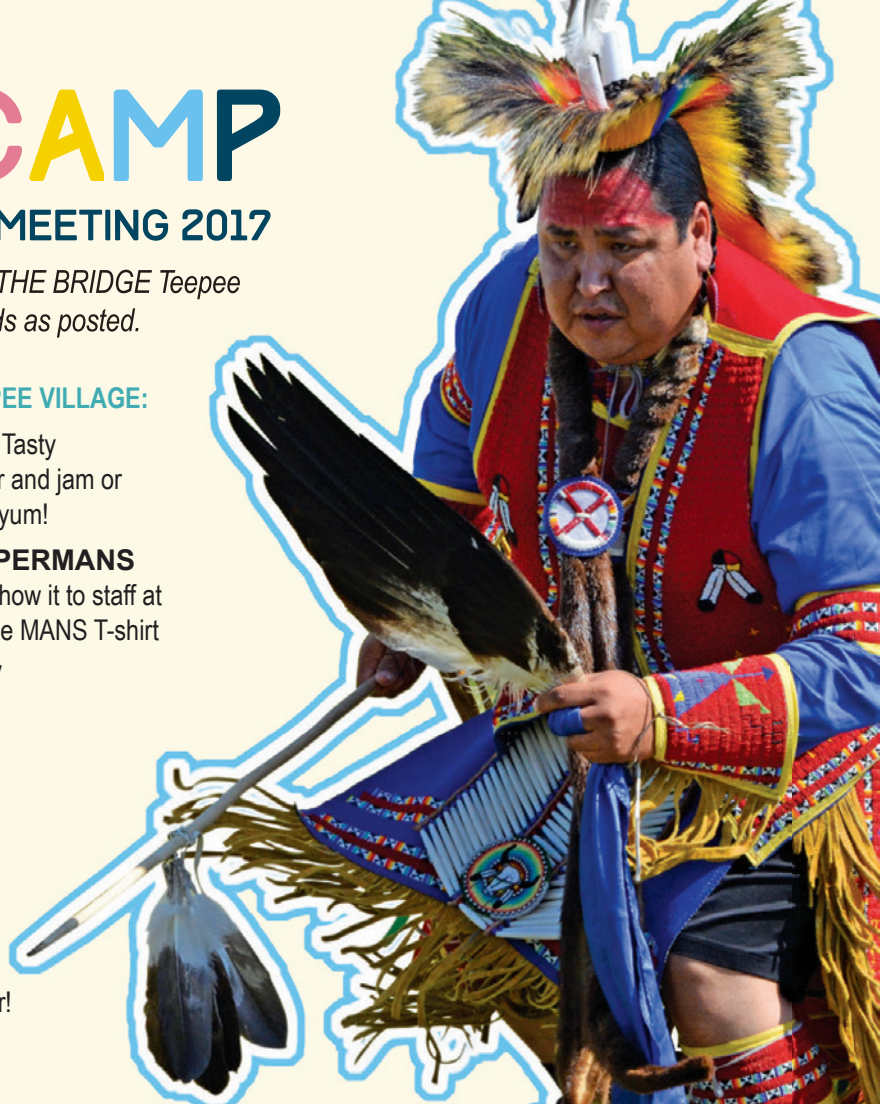

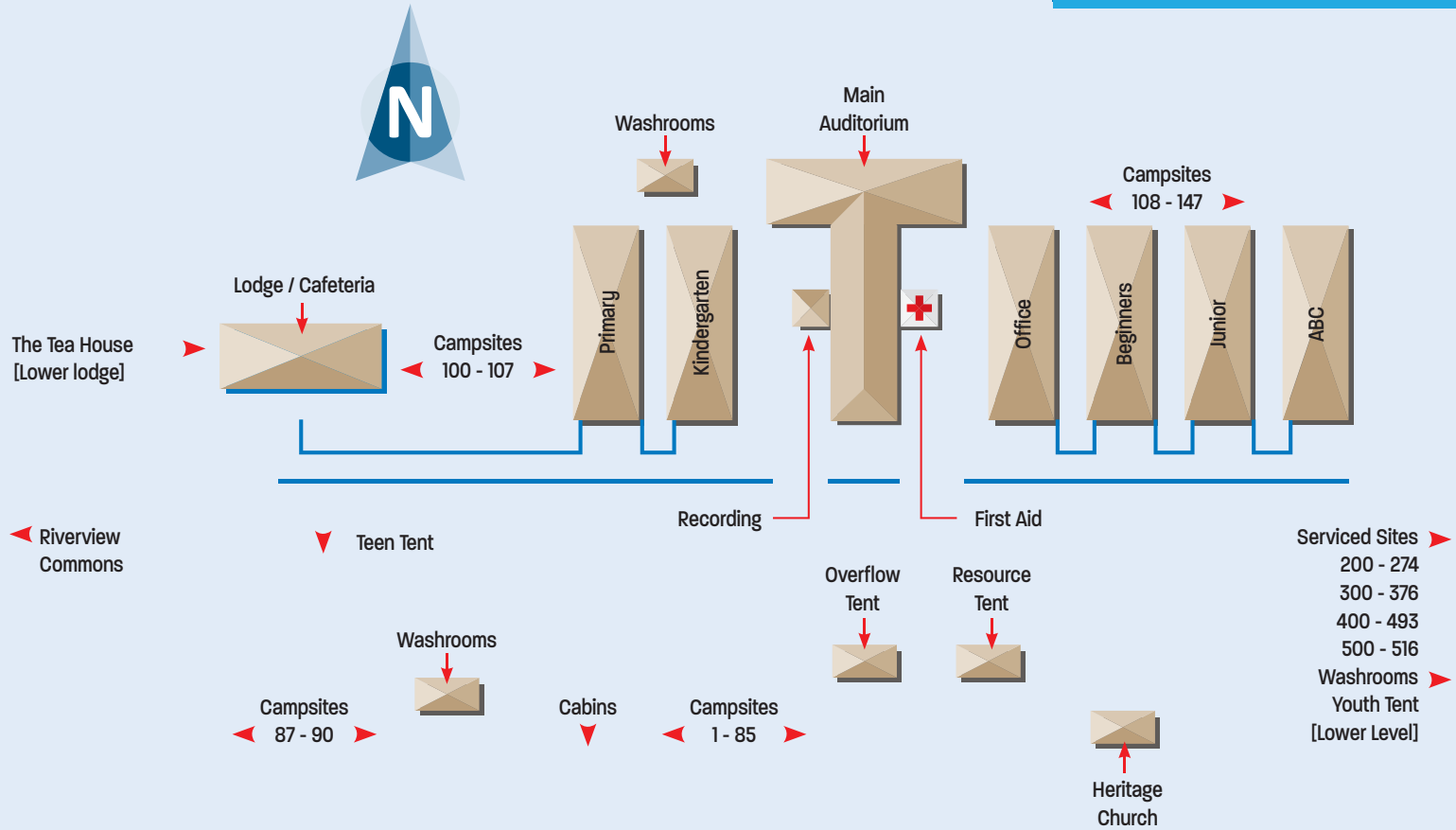
